Two buildings were torn down - the Humanities Building (the first permanent building on the San Pablo campus, which opened in 1956) and the Student Activities Building/Cafeteria (1958 & 1965). They were replaced by a new Student and Administration Building (bookstore, cafeteria, restaurant and administration offices), Fireside Hall, and a General Education classroom buildings while also totally changing the campus layout (its map now resembles a butterfly.) The center of campus has shifted; it is finally close to its postal address on Mission Bell Drive!

Last September, the CCC Foundation/Development Office hosted a tour of the new buildings, followed by a luncheon for retirees in the new Culinary Arts restaurant, Aqua Terra. CCC History Highlight



Contra Costa Junior College, West Campus began in 1949 in the former Kaiser Shipyard No. 3 in Point Richmond. The first classes started February 14, 1950 with a beginning enrollment of 500 students. The campus consisted of an assortment of old shipyard buildings, some wooden structures, no grass, lots of blacktop, and a parking lot with a (working) railroad line running through it. Talk about problem parking!

The cafeteria is the last of the original buildings; a plaque was mounted on it in 2000 to commemorate the college's 50th anniversary.
