(Bruce) Lights the Second Candle

(Diane) Reads the SUMMARY OF NEWS FROM SONOMA & NAPA FIRES

Betty Bortz: Atlas fire came very close to her house. She had to evacuate and stay with a friend temporarily, but she and her house are fine.

Cheryl Dembe had a harrowing experience driving out of Geyersville where she was visiting the night of the fire. She made it out and is here with us today.

Ken & Alice Green – had to evacuate early in the morning, but they and their house are fine. They're here with us today.

Bill Harlan's family---fires around them, but they got out OK. Bill is here today.

Tim Murphy who lives in Santa Rosa had to evacuate in the middle of the night, but they did get out. He's here today.

Phyllis Peterson – lives in Placerville. Fires did not reach her. She's fine.

C. (Judy) Then we light a third candle celebrating the neighbors, friends, colleagues, witnesses, guardian angels, ordinary heroes/heroines. All Helping others...providing strength and caring. We acknowledge the losses, pain and suffering but we also remember the beauty of the human connection, the help that comes, the love that pours out, the honoring of the memory of those who have been affected ... witnessing the more transcendent aspect of our human nature...the compassion, the willingness of others to share in the healing and the moving forward process.
