

BARBARA SAWYER

DIANE SCOTT-SUMMERS

Who provided sound guidance to our organization, serving as co-facilitator and emcee; who showed the world how over the years, a teenage DVC student can rise to the top as acting president of her alma mater; who always had time to listen to the queries of new faculty members. She hawked silent auction items; read and responded to e-mails with great patience; and, most important, she nurtured all DVC students, so many of whom looked to her as a superb role model.

Diablo Valley College Retirees Association Financial Report

For the Period Jan. 1, 2018 to Aug. 15, 2018

The primary purpose for the DVCRA's fundraising is to award scholarships to DVC students. The Association first awarded scholarships in 2008, and we have given out a total of \$77,400 in scholarships through 2018. We award and fund scholarships in the spring, and our major fundraising efforts occur during the summer. Consequently, the funds raised in 2018 will be used to fund scholarships in 2019.

- We have \$18,750 in cash held in our bank accounts at Travis Credit Union and the DVC Foundation.
- Our fundraising activities in 2018 (including donations, memberships, and auctions) generated \$8,184 available for scholarships.
 This is a 47% reduction in fundraising compared to the same time period in 2017.
- We had \$13,113 in expenditures during 2018 including \$12,000 for scholarships, \$887 for luncheons, and \$86 for office expenses. Also, we transferred \$140 to the DVC Foundation for donations we received for the DVC Food Pantry.
- We still owe our scholarship recipients \$2,400.
 The DVC Foundation is in the process of sending these funds to the scholarship recipients.

Due to declining donations in 2018, the Board decided to initially approve the amount of \$10,000 for scholarships in 2019 (10 scholarships for \$1,000 each). Six scholarships will go to continuing DVC students, and four scholarships will go to transferring students. If we receive a significant number of donations before the end of 2018, we have the ability to increase the scholarships for 2019.

We want to thank our members for their continuing generosity to the students of DVC.

Dick Kamprath Died August 9, 2018

Music instructor Richard (Dick) E. Kamprath passed away at his home in Martinez on August 9, 2018.

Dick was hired in 1964 and began the men's and women's choir, started the class voice program, taught piano, advanced piano, and keyboard harmony. Later, Dick directed operas and musicals, founded the Masterworks Chorale which, under his direction, performed much of the great choral literature. Dick retired from DVC in 1998.

Dick is survived by his son John Kamprath; daughters Johanna Sindelar and Odilie Moreland; brother Frederich Kamprath; sister Marilyn Tucker; 17 grandchildren; as well as many extended family members and close friends.

Rhonda Mims Died Sept. 14, 2018

Rhonda Mims, friend and family member, passed away suddenly on Friday, September 14. She was hired by our District on October 30, 2000 and retired earlier this year from the position of Police Services Dispatcher, assigned to DVC. Rhonda was a loving daughter, sister, sister-in-law, aunt, niece, cousin, coworker and friend to so many. She spent the better part of the last decade bravely battling kidney disease, and she will be remembered as someone who



put the interests of her coworkers and the community before her own, regardless of her personal health.

Rhonda had a true connection to the Contra Costa Community College District: her father, Dr. Leroy Mims, was formerly a Dean at CCC, while her sister, Rhonelle, previously worked for the Child Care Center at DVC.

Services were held at Oakmont Memorial Park & Mortuary in Lafayette in September.
